ROSES FROM THE HEART (Convict bonnets)	All day	Christina Henri, of the Roses from the Heart project which remembers all of the 25,566 women who were transported to Australia and their children. Some of these women would have worked at Glen Derwent. The Cullens family who built Glen Derwent were originally convicts. Christina will be present with a display of bonnets and available to talk about the project. Find out how to make a convict bonnet.	Glen Derwent house
BIRDS OF A FEATHER	All day	Several peacocks and peahens, including Heathcliff who is rather a character, and there are Muscovy ducks, chooks and perhaps Native Hens to admire as well.	Around the grounds
PERIOD SHEEP	All day	Black Faced Suffolk sheep to admire (breed first named in 1797)	Probably the Eastern Paddock
